## Technological Centre Vilafranca Virtual

On October, 2002, the activities of the Technological Centre Vilafranca Virtual began. The Centre belongs to the Town Council of Vilafranca del Penedes (Catalonia, Spain) and it is as well the headquarters of the Productive Learning Institute (IDAP) of Vilafranca. This centre has at its disposal, a video and multimedia classroom with capacity for 10 people and an assisted self-directed learning classroom, with capacity for 16 people. It also has a reception, offices, an Internet Access Point and a meeting room for 25 people. In little more than a year, the Centre has already offered training to more than 900 people, always through the use of the Productive Learning methodology.

Every week, 130 to 150 people come to the Centre in order to get some training in relation to the new technologies. 40 more people come in order to connect themselves to Internet. Each week, the Technological Centre also receives the visit of around 40 students from the Open University of Catalonia (UOC) that may come to get some information, to bring in certain documents or to connect themselves to the Virtual Campus as well.

Now, with the ALCOAis Foundation support, the Technological Centre of Vilafranca Virtual has had the opportunity of furnishing itself with a multimedia room with the most advanced technologies in order to offer a dynamic and innovative training and with the possibility of doing interactive presentations and vide oconferences. An interactive board with an electromagnetic pen, a projector and a vide oconference equipment become the most remarkable part of the whole equipment. The room, with capacity for 25 people, also has at its disposal a meeting table, a portable computer, a retro-projector, a printer-photocopy machine. sound equipment with wireless microphones, amplifier, loudspeakers, mini-disc, VHS reproducer and DVD multi-zone. Everything is under the control of a multimedia computer that works with a wireless keyboard as well as a wireless mouse and a TFT Josep Alsina, Vilafranca screen.
